People to People Project Envisions... Communities in the rural areas of Laos living in a more healthy, resourceful environment.

Our Project's Mission is... To work with the Laotian government and village leaders to provide potable water, access to basic health care and basic education to the Luang Prabang province.

Our Project's Strategy is... To appeal to the giving spirit of our community members – of all ages – to join us in our mission of providing these needs and expanding the Wausau area's network of caring and encouraging self-reliance around the world.



Our Project's History... Immediately after the war in Southeast Asia, several thousand Hmong, Khmu, Lahu, Mien and other ethnic groups escaped the country and relocated to the United States. The Wausau area became home to many of these refugees. For family members and friends that were not able to leave, their primary refuge remains the rural areas of Laos. Today it is nearly impossible for them to immigrate, requiring them to live under current conditions.

The People to People Project initiative was created at the request of the Wausau Hmong community to reach out to the less fortunate members of the world's Hmong and other ethnic groups residing in Laos. In 2006, People to People Project, Inc. became a volunteer-directed 501(c)(3) tax deductible organization.

Our mission centers on the following current needs:

Potable water – Providing potable water is a realistic goal. Through the construction of a concrete catchment and a series of filtering structures connected with plastic piping, potable water from mountain sources can be brought to the center of a village for approximately \$5,000 to \$15,000 (the cost depends upon the distance of the village from the water source).

Basic healthcare – While the goal may seem modest, providing a first aid facility within a six-hour walk of all residents will be a significant improvement. The cost of constructing a basic building is approximately \$15,000 to \$20,000.

Basic education – The goal is to provide an opportunity for all children to obtain an 8th grade or higher level of education. Each concrete structure, with a cost of approximately \$35,000 to \$50,000, will open the doors to education for about 400 students.

We are working on moving from immediate needs to long-term development by providing training and ownership of community projects.
