Treating Hypertension/high blood pressure in the Elderly

This finding is from the Journal of the American College of Cardiology: there is LITTLE EVIDENCE to base treatment of the elderly for hypertension. In other words, there is not a lot of research to support putting the elderly on medication without other less invasive treatments tried first. The article goes on to say "treatment may consist simply of lifestyle modification". This would mean diet and exercise. Instead an "expert consensus" is recommending that "3 consecutive readings taken on at least 2 separate office visits". It goes on to say the clinician's job is to determine reversible or treatable causes, any organ damage, and determine other cardiovascular risks. The recommended goal is still 140/90 mm. Hg., which many feel is still too low. Anything beyond 20/10 mm. Hg. higher than base is recommended for a 2-drug therapy. A study in March 14, 2010 in the New England Journal of Medicine proved aggressively lowering blood pressure by medication in individuals with Type 2 Diabetes from a systolic reading of 140 to 120 made no difference in their mortality/adverse events. A study way back in 2007 that specific Atlas adjustments (such as the one we do here in our office)

has the same effect as 2 blood pressure medications without any ill side effects, according to study leader George Bakris, M.D. This was done over an 8 week period. Injury or misalignment at the Atlas/C1 vertebral area can affect blood flow in the arteries.
