#### Pastor's Corner...

Consider these excerpts from an article on the Internet about the origin of the word, "educate."

#### What does the word, "education" mean?

The word 'education' has been derived from Latin word-'Educare...'

The term 'educare' means to bring up, to rise, and to nourish, to train or mould. The child has to be brought up like a plant in the garden by the teacher. His potentialities should be developed with proper care and nourishment.

It means 'to lead out', 'to draw out' and 'to bring forth'. The innate powers of the individual should be properly cared and given scope to develop. (Article by Dilip Bhatt, Professor of English)

The first definition sounds a lot like what Solomon wrote in the Book of Proverbs:

Train a child in the way he should go, and when he is old he will not turn from it. – Proverbs 22:6







# Quarterly Voters Meeting July 22, 2018

The meeting was called to order by President Rick Guralski and Pastor Mark Schwalenberg opened with prayer. 22 members were present.

<u>Secretary Report:</u> Motion was made by Ken Brice, seconded by Renell Wassmann and carried, to accept the Secretary's Report as printed in the monthly bulletin. Motion carried.

<u>Financial Report:</u> Indicated total income for the second quarter was \$130,640; total expenses \$125,600 resulting in a net gain of \$5,040. Line of credit balance was \$3,946, Organ Fund was \$676, Major Building Repair Fund \$14,734, Basement Project Fund was \$2,761. Endowment fund with Thrivent is at \$104,087. Alan Mortenson sent in \$2,000 to be reinvested with Scottrade (now Ameritrade) and the balance is now \$18,690.86. A motion was made by John Punke, seconded by Ken Punke to accept the financial report. Motion carried.

<u>Board of Elders:</u> Next Sunday is church at the pond service. Church services will be moving back to Saturday after Labor Day. The board requested authority to make the decision on the services times when this change occurs. John Punke made a motion that the Board of Elders has the authority to make the decision to determine the best time for services on Saturdays, second by Wil Strack. Members discussed. Motion carried.

<u>Board of Christian Education and Principal's Report:</u> Child Care has posted two positions to replace Debbie Balz and Sharon Myszka. The FOCE money has been used for chrome books and for new computers for staff. The board members continue to work on outstanding tuition. The board members are also discussing adding a new position to the school that would be split between IT and teaching 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> grade.

<u>Principal:</u> Theme next year will be, Be Strong and Courageous and will go with a superhero theme. Dean Frick provided an update on the Child Care staffing needs. Thank you to Courtney for covering extra hours during the short staffing time. Dean applied for a School Safety Grant, there were some changes that needed to be made and the grant was resubmitted. We requested \$18,000. These funds would be used to help separate the church from the school and install a panic alarm system. Dean provided members on the reasoning and background on the recommendation to consider adding a new staff member for IT and to also assist with 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> grade teaching. The plan would be to add this position for the next school year, not this year. There is a shortage of teachers and if we would like to add this position we would need to start recruiting in early 2019. We anticipate enrollment for the coming school year to be about the same as the last year. Members discussed. This will be further discussed at the October meeting.

**Board of Trustees**: None.

Board of Stewardship: None.

<u>Youth:</u> Crusaders complete the cancer walk. The mission trip went well. Team Trinity went to laser tag to finish out the season. Next summer will be the NYG. Two students and one adult will be going to the Servant event in Mequon.

Pastor: Addressed in new business.

#### Old Business: None

New Business: Rick provided an update on the District Convention that he attended. Pastor Mark provided an update on installing air conditioning in the Church. Nubby's was approached for this need and a bid was received for a ductless split system. The Catholic Church has the same system. The bid was \$21,900. A Friedrich system would be \$16,900. Electric wiring would cost \$4,693 by Martin Weise. Pastor requested that we start this as soon at we raise \$15,000 for the project. Motion made by Jean Balz, second by Mark Schroeder to start discussions on installing this air conditioning system. Doug Krueger would volunteer his services for the mounting piece of this project. John Punke amended the motion that when we have 80% of funds that we proceed to adding the Friedrich air conditioning systems, second by Dean Frick. Further discussion was held. Motion carried. Pastor Mark provided a second presentation proposing modifications to the current sanctuary to omit the need to climb stairs for communion and also to be able to provide a permanent setup for the Praise band. Members discussed. Materials for this project could come out of the major building repair fund. Estimates will be gathered for this project and it will be brought up at a special or fall voter's assembly.

Motion was made by Dawn Mroczenski, seconded by Linda Punke, and carried to adjourn the meeting. Closed with prayer.

Line of credit balance was \$7,824; Organ Fund was \$676; Major Building Repair Fund was \$15,712; Church Basement Fund was \$2,761. The balance in the checking account was \$2. Endowment Fund at Thrivent was \$104,088; Brokerage Account at Scott Trade was \$18,691; Special Interest Fund at LCEF was \$305. Motion made by Renell Wassmann to accept the Financial Report, seconded by Dawn Mroczenski. Motion carried.

**Board of Christian Education:** We need a Child Care Director. There have been two applicants. Also need a 3k and 4k aide and two child care teachers. The school was awarded a school safety grant to make safety upgrades to the building. Sunday School organizational meeting will be August  $23^{rd}$  with Sunday school starting Sept  $9^{th}$ . Back to school night will be August 28th. Staff will be doing peaceful warriors, active shooter training again this year.

Pastor will put this in the bulletin and encourage people to come to the meeting in October to discuss this.

**Youth:** Mission trip is completed. Two student and one adult when to the serving Christ conference in Mequon. NYG had their first meeting for the trip in St. Paul. They need a \$100 deposit paid down to reserve a spot. They will be doing the youth fair stand again this year. They will be doing a garbage pickup for the steam show as well. Crusaders and the junior group meetings will be starting in September. Thank you to Fritz Balz for revising the fair stand and including a third fryer.

**Old Business:** Pastor and Rick continue to discuss the missions committee. The purpose of the committee would be to connect our church with the community and the world. They would be responsible for advertising, missions outside of Athens, possibly supporting a missionary, and equipping members with tools to reach out to members in the community. We are looking for people to participate in this committee. Rick is going to include something in the newsletter as this first step to get this committee going.
