

WI Trail Pass Information

Beginning July 1, 2015 snowmobile registrations will cost \$30 and last for 3 years. New for the winter of 2015, all snowmobiles will be required to display a Wisconsin Trail Pass sticker to operate on public trails and corridors. The annual trail passes are separate from registrations and will need to be purchased each year. The cost of a Trail Pass is \$30 for snowmobilers who are not members of a snowmobile club and the Association of Wisconsin Snowmobile Clubs (AWSC) and may be purchased through the DNR online or at any DNR licensed sales agent.

A \$10 discounted trail pass will be available to those who currently belong to both a WI snowmobile club and the AWSC. (Your membership in Devil's Creek Stump Jumpers includes your AWSC membership.) The discounted pass will be available for each of your WI registered snowmobiles through the AWSC. All trail pass stickers will be delivered by U.S. mail.

To obtain your discounted trail pass – You will need:

1. Your AWSC number. This can be found on your AWSC card and on the address label of your Wisconsin Snowmobile News magazine.
2. The registration numbers from the snowmobiles for which you are purchasing passes.

Trail pass will be available by:

1. Ordering online at www.awsc.org with a credit card
2. Mailing in a check along with your AWSC number and snowmobile registration number
3. Calling the AWSC office and placing an order with a credit card
4. Walking into the office and placing an order

Members will want to order their trail passes early and not wait until they are ready to ride to take advantage of the discount. It will still be the club's responsibility to collect your club membership dues and submit the \$10 AWSC dues to the Association. Memberships are good for one year and, if it is current, you will be allowed to purchase a discounted trail pass for every snowmobile registered in the name of the member, their spouse or any of their children under the age of 19.

NOTE: Your AWSC card indicates the date your membership is good through.

Trail pass fees for non-residents will increase from \$35 per year to \$50 per year and may be purchased through the DNR. There is no discounted option for non-resident trail passes.

Revenue generated from the sale of snowmobile registrations and trail passes goes into the segregated snowmobile account which is used to maintain and develop the more than 22,000 miles of trails that make up Wisconsin's snowmobile trail system. WI snowmobile trails are made possible by snowmobile club volunteers who provide the labor to brush, sign and groom the trails, and the landowners who allow the trails to cross their property.
