



FROM THE DEACON'S DESK

Today is the first Sunday of Advent and also the first Sunday of the new liturgical year. In this new liturgical year, the Gospel of Matthew will be the primary Gospel proclaimed (Lectionary Cycle A). The Advent season includes the four Sundays that precede Christmas and for us is a time of preparation for the birth of our Lord. In this season, we recall two central elements of our faith: the final coming of the Lord in glory and the incarnation of our Lord in the birth of Jesus. The key themes of the Advent season are watchful waiting and preparation. Advent is a time especially blessed by God which calls us to stay awake and to prepare in joyful hope for the coming of Jesus. Advent is an invitation to renew our Christian commitment and to start living a life that is worthy of Christ and to prepare for his final coming at the end of time. The reality of our life in this world is that eventually it will end. As St. Paul tells us, we must awake from our sinful ways and put on Christ. So, this Advent season, amidst all the holiday hustle and bustle, maybe we can take a little extra time to better prepare ourselves for the celebration of His birth. Eucharistic Adoration, extra daily prayers or service to the less fortunate are all ways we can prepare for His birth and draw closer to Him. Remember that we do not know how much time we have. Therefore, we must always be prepared. We must strive to live today as if it were the last day of our lives.
