Regulations

- 1. St. Paul Cemetery has been blessed and is considered a sacred place. Any ornamentation on monuments and markers must be in keeping with the sacred character of the cemetery.
- 2. The holder of burial rights is known as the lot holder. The lot holder has title only to the burial rights on a given lot, but not to the land itself. The title to all cemetery land remains with St. Paul Parish.
- 3. Lot holders who wish to relinquish burial rights are to sell them back to the cemetery for the original price. The Cemetery Association reserves the right to resell lots according to its own criteria.
- 4. All lots are sold with perpetual care included.
- 5. Burial lots must be paid for before a burial or placement of a monument or marker.
- 6. Concrete vaults or cremation vaults are required for all burials. Baby caskets should be of non-biodegradable material.
- 7. One cemetery space can receive one casket or two cremains.
- 8. Shepherd's hooks, candles, wreaths or flowers can only be placed on the tombstone or in the base extension. Nothing is to be placed directly on the ground. Artificial flower containers must be attached to the monument. All others will be removed. No glass or wire containers are allowed.
- 9. No feeders, birdhouses, food or fencing are allowed.
- 10. Wreaths are permitted on graves for Christmas but must be removed by April 1 or the Cemetery Caretaker will remove and dispose of them. Any unsightly flowers, decorations, etc. will be removed.
- 11. Grass cutting will be done by the Cemetery Caretaker only. No weeds or refuse should be left at the gravesite.
- 12. No shrubs or trees may be planted.
- 13. No hunting, dogs, snowmobiles or ATVs allowed in Cemetery.
- 14. It is the responsibility of the family to have headstones covered by their homeowner's insurance policy. St. Paul Cemetery is not responsible for any repairs or replacement, which might be required for damage that may occur due to vandalism, weather, etc.
- 15. In the event of exhumation, family members are not to be allowed. This is for the emotional care of the family.
