NEW POLICE LOCKER ROOM INSTALLATION

In October 2010, the Hesperia Police Department relocated to a new facility to better accommodate their growing staff. Their old building was 7,600 square feet and once housed a convenience store. The new building was 43,000 square feet and would easily accommodate their growing 75-member police force.

The Hesperia Police Department's undersized "school lockers" did not have the appropriate amount of space to store their necessities. The lockers were not designed to store their equipment and could not hold up to the daily use by officers. To compound problems, the small locker rooms could not fit any additional lockers.
