A LOCKER ROOM THAT DOESNT SMELL LIKE A LOCKER ROOM

In 2010, the University of Iowa Police Department was in the market for a new, more spacious locker room as part of their growing facility. "The condition of our old locker room was bad," said Captain Loren Noska. "We were forced to squeeze 30 officers and 215 security guards into a 15' x 15' square room. The lockers were so small it was near impossible to close the locker door without bending the hanger holding your uniform."
