January is Human Trafficking Awareness Month

Human trafficking is prohibited by federal and state law. The elements of human trafficking involve the full process of trafficking from initial recruitment of the victim to the exploitation of the victim. Attempts to traffic are also a crime. Sex trafficking of children is a crime that involves the use of children in the commercial sex industry, whether or not any force, fraud or coercion is involved. Any involvement of a minor in sexual acts for money or anything of value, including basic survival needs, is against the law.

During an intake session at HAVEN, we ask the following two questions and check the box if the survivor says 'yes'.

Have you worked for someone or done any other activities for which you thought you would be paid? □ Human Trafficking: Labor

Has anyone ever made you do something you did not want to do, sexually, for money/basic needs? □ Human Trafficking: Sex

In 2023, eight Lincoln County residents, between the ages of 25-56, disclosed they have been either labor or sex trafficked.
