

As you search for a home, watch for the trends below. You'll find today's new homes deliver on the features that buyers like you want most. And when you've found your new dream home, keep these ideas in mind as you feather your new nest.

Let's take a look at how today's new homes compare to resale homes in delivering:

The Top 10 Features Home Buyers Want

1. Open Concept Homes — New homes offer spacious, flowing floorplans and high ceilings that older houses don't provide.

2. Smaller Homes — McMansions are expensive to heat, cool and maintain. The wide array of new homes make it easy to find the size just right for you.

3. Outdoor Living Spaces — True in Canada and even more so in the many temperate areas of the U.S. For example, the 2011 Design Driver Survey from AvidBuilder found that 31.4 percent of move-up buyers (people moving to a larger home) said they either must have or really want an outdoor fireplace.

4. Neutral Decor — Probably best for selling a home. However, as a new home buyer, don't be afraid to display your true colors. As we've reported in our blog, whether it's hip designer Jonathan Adler bringing bold colors back to the kitchen with his line of vibrant sinks for Kohler or furniture and bedding in the current Color of the Year (tangerine) more and more homeowners are bravely adopting brighter hues.

5. Modern Kitchens — The heart of every home. This is where new homes shine with the latest and greatest design, cabinets, countertops and lighting -- to say nothing of state-of-the-art appliances.

6. Smart Growth — Many of today's master planned new home communities offer community clubhouses and pools, protected nature areas, hiking trails, playgrounds and more. Larger new home communities often contain carefully planned retail options and even schools inside the community. It's also not uncommon to find master-planned communities that water common areas with reclaimed water . Which leads us to....

7. Going Green — Hands down, new homes win here, too. The Home Energy Rating System (also known as a HERS Score) is an industry standard that rates the energy efficiency of homes. The lower the score, the more energy efficient the home. As the people behind HERS point out on their site, the U.S. Department of Energy has determined that a typical new home is 30 percent more energy efficient than a typical resale house.

8. Linen Closets & Smart Storage — New homes take the win in this category, too. Simply compare the much larger walkin closets of today's new homes with the cramped closest of old homes.

9. Energy-Efficient Fixtures & Appliances — Our new vs. resale home comparison is turning into a rout. Today's new homes feature enormous energy efficiency in appliances, HVAC (heating, ventilation and cooling equipment) and throughout the house. As we saw, a typical new home of today is 30 percent more energy efficient than one built just five years ago. Compare a typical new home built today to a 10-20 year old home? Game over!

10. Double Car Garage with Organized Work/Storage Space — You'd be hard-pressed to find a new home that doesn't score a "10" on criteria number 10. Many builders also offer three-car garages (or larger) that offer enough storage space to make the man of the house grow weak in the knees.

6 Hot Weather Safety Tips for Builders

Don't sweat the summer heat with these safety tips.

One of our business networking tips is to attend local industry trade shows.

The summer months are typically the busiest in the construction trades. With longer days out in the hot sun, construction teams are also susceptible to heat-related safety concerns. Protect your crew with these hot weather safety tips for builders:

Stay hydrated

Take cooling breaks

Pack a hot weather_friendly lunch

Use sunscreen

Wear sun_protective gear

Watch for heat exhaustion

Find out more about each of these safety tips for builders below.

Stay hydrated

One of the most obvious summer safety tips for builders is to drink water frequently – to the point that you never begin to feel thirsty. Non-caffeinated beverages with electrolytes can also help you and your crew replenish essential salts that regulate your body's water intake and help it function.

Take cooling breaks

Even while working vigorously toward a deadline, it's vital to make an effort to keep cool on the job. Taking short breaks in the shade and avoiding intense labor during the highest intensity periods of the sun (between 12-3PM) can help. You can also stock cooling towels or ice water buckets with rags nearby to aid with quick cool-down.

Pack a hot weather_friendly lunch

Another summer safety tip for builders is to be sure to pack a lunch that's appropriate for working outside in the heat. Food high in fat and preservatives will make it harder on your body to digest when it's hot. Consider eating a big breakfast before heading out on the job, and bring healthy snacks and a nutritious light lunch that includes fruits, vegetables, carbohydrates, and lean protein to fuel your energy and keep you cool.

Use sunscreen

Sunscreen is the skin's first line of defense against the dangerous impact of the sun's rays. Go for a broad-spectrum sunscreen that offers protection from both UVB and UVA radiation, with a high Sun Protection Factor (SPF). A water-resistant formula may also be wise for construction crews who are outside in the sun most of their workday. Lastly, don't forget to reapply at least every two hours, or even more frequently when sweating.

Wear sun_protective gear

Wear light clothing, a wide-brimmed hard hat, and safety glasses that offer UVB and UVA protection when out in the



sun. Some clothing offers UPF protection of 50 or higher. Be sure to also practice construction safety measures like using a harness when working at elevated heights – this precaution will help protect you from falling if you get dizzy or experience signs of a heat-related illness.

Watch for heat exhaustion

Be alert for signs of heat exhaustion in yourself and your coworkers. Early symptoms can include lethargy, disorientation, stumbling, slurred speech, and dropping tools. If someone appears to be exhibiting signs of heat-related illness, call your supervisor and 911 immediately.

These summer weather safety tips for builders can help you stay cool and safe at your job site during the hottest months of the year.

WBA Leadership Testifies in Favor of Building Permit Bill

Recently, Assembly Bill 117 (AB 117) was heard before the Assembly Housing and Real Estate Committee. The Bill has 22 total coauthors: 15 republicans and seven democrats.

You may remember that one of the most direct asks that WBA members made while attending Advocacy Day 2019 was for members of the state's assembly and senate to sign on as a coauthor to this legislation. The bipartisan list of 22 coauthors is an impressive number and we are very thankful to those that made the ask to cosponsor this bill during legislative meetings on Advocacy Day. A public hearing on the assembly version of the bill was held on Tuesday, April

23. WBA President Harvey Kessel, Treasurer Abe Degnan, and Outside Legal Counsel Robert Procter joined Executive Director Brad Boycks to provide background in support of AB 117.

There was no opposition expressed to AB 117 during the public hearing and expect this bill to be voted out of committee soon, hopefully with a unanimous vote of support.

Michael Derrick named Advocacy Group Vice_Chair

Recently, WBA President Harvey Kessel announced that Michael Derrick of Derrick Companies in New Richmond had accepted his offer to become the Vice-Chair of the Advocacy Group in 2019. After the February 2020 Advocacy Group meeting, Derrick will assume the Chair of the Advocacy Group through the first meeting of the group in 2021.

Please join us in welcoming Michael, as we look forward to working with him as Vice-Chair and Chair of the Advocacy Group over the next two years.

DSPS Secretary Designee Crim Visits Chippewa Valley Builders Association

In April, Department of Safety and Professional Services (DSPS) Secretary Designee Dawn Crim attended a roundtable meeting with members of the Chippewa Valley Builders Association. This served as way for Secretary Designee Crim to learn more about housing and for members to share any thoughts about the services currently being offered by DSPS.

We hope to be work with DSPS staff to help facilitate more visits to additional HBAs as Secretary Crim travels the state in the weeks and months to come.

Governor Evers Announces "Joint Enforcement Task Force on Payroll Fraud and Worker Misclassification"

Recently Governor Tony Evers announced the creation of the "Joint Enforcement Task Force on Payroll Fraud and Worker Misclassification" via executive order.

The task force will consist of Department of Workforce Development and Department (DWD) of Revenue Secretaries, the heads of the Workers Compensation and Unemployment Insurance Divisions at DWD, and appointees from the Attorney General and Commission of Insurance as well as those to serve "at the pleasure of the governor".

The task force has a laundry list of things to study and report back to the governor by March of each year. To see what the task force is directed to investigate and more details about Executive Order 20 click here.

State Budget Update Good News for WBA Policy Initiatives

Since the Joint Committee on Finance began voting on Governor Evers' state budget, several positive developments related to WBA's policy goals have been either eliminated or retained in the budget.

Provisions that WBA opposed that have been eliminated from the state budget include:

- Changes to TIF laws
- Eliminating flexibilities for municipalities to exceed revenue limits that would have likely increased property taxes
- Prevailing wages law changes that would have increased the cost of developer financed intrastate in subdivisions

Only one item remains that we have been lobbying against, a 27% increase in the registration fee for heavy trucks. This provision will likely be addressed when the budget committee takes up a comprehensive transportation package in the weeks to come.

We were also advocating for an increase in funds to upgrade credentialing technology and increase staff to handle credentialing. The budget committee approved onetime funding to address technology updates to the trades credentialing system and funding for six additional staff positions to address issues with credentialing backlogs for the trades.

One additional item that we support and are waiting to be addressed is Gov. Evers' proposal to create a first-time homebuyer savings accounts starting in 2020.

So far, we are off to a great start as the budget committee continues to change Governor Evers' state budget.

NAHB Statement on Trade Developments with Mexico and Canada

NAHB Chairman Greg Ugalde issued the following statement after the White House announced the United States would remove tariffs on steel and aluminum imports from Canada and Mexico:

"NAHB commends President Trump for removing tariffs on steel and aluminum imports from Canada and Mexico. This will provide momentum for Congress to ratify the United States-Mexico-Canada Agreement (USMCA), which holds the potential to lift the housing economy.

"Now that the White House has achieved substantial progress in advancing the USMCA, we urge the administration to focus its efforts on resolving the softwood lumber trade dispute with Canada. Tariffs averaging more than 20 percent on Canadian softwood lumber shipments into the U.S. are exacerbating price volatility and needlessly driving up housing costs. A prompt resolution to this ongoing trade conflict with our neighbor to the north will help to ease ongoing housing affordability concerns."
