State Senate Passed Property/Income Tax Cut

Another sign to the old adage that "elections have consequences" was seen again recenty when the Wisconsin State Senate voted to pass a slightly modified version of Governor Walker's "Blueprint for Prosperity" on a 17-15 vote (Senator Jauch was absent recovering for surgery). All democrats present voted no in addition to

State Senator Dale Schultz (R-Richland Center).

The current GOP majority in the state senate allowed them a one seat cushion to pass the bill. This is the same formula that was used earlier in the session to pass the mining bill without Schultz's vote.

Going into the 2012 election, most assumed that then Representative Tom Tiffany would win the state senate seat formally held by the retiring Jim Holperin, which he did handily to get the GOP the majority back. State Senate Republicans were not shy in saying they needed a +2 majority to get some important issues passed in 2013-2014. They got that +2 majority when Rick Gudex defeated State Senator Jessica King (D-Oshkosh) by 599 votes after a recall took place.

So, the tax plan strongly supported by WBA to provide permanent property and income tax relief now goes back to the state assembly where it likely will again receive bipartisan support and then on to Governor Walker to become law.

Thanks to those that lobbied on this important topic during Business Day in Madison 2014 and for anyone who called or e-mailed your member of the state senate in support of the effort leading up to the vote this week in the state senate.

Surety bills get unanimous committee votes

The Senate Committee on Government Operations, Public Works and Telecommunications and the Assembly Committee on Energy and Utilities both took votes recently on our efforts to get better structure on the process of surety for dedicated infrastructure.

The senate committee acted first via a paper ballot and the result was a 7-0 vote in support. Every member of the committee voted in favor which included senators Farrow, Gudex, Lasee, Kedzie, Shilling, Wirch, and Harris.

Next up was the assembly committee who met in person with similar results, a 9-0 vote in favor. Present members of the committee voting yes were representatives Kuglitsch, Larson, Jacque, Weininger, Neylon, Petersen, Zepnick, Kahl, and Shankland.

The next step in the process is to get these bills through both houses of the legislature in the same form before they adjourn which is likely to be April 1, 2014. We are hopeful that the assembly goes first in moving the bill on Thursday, March 20 which is rumored to be their last day in session.

If the assembly moves the bill first, we are then asking that the bill be heard before the full State Senate on their last day in session on April 1.

More work to be done on this effort but we have made tremendous progress in a very short amount of time to conclude this legislative session.

Use the Building Inspector Review Board for complaints

Recently I learned that DSPS's Building Inspector Review Board has no pending cases for review. The DSPS Building Inspector Review Board was established by the legislature and supported by WBA to provide a way for builders and consumer to voice concerns about building inspectors.

I was advised by DSPS to let members know that if they have an issue with a local building inspector and want to see action taken by the department they are encouraged to start the process by going on line and filling out a form.

It is important to note that you can request that your submittal to the Building Inspector Review Board can be kept confidential if you click "yes" on the first screen of the online form.

Burke/Walker campaigns take to the airwaves

After the Republican Governor's Association took to the airwaves recently, that sparked Democrat Mary Burke to go up on television and then Governor Walker to counter with his first ad of the campaign to counter. It has been a good few weeks to work in public relations, or better yet, to own a television station in Wisconsin.

Mary Burke for Wisconsin went first when they launched their first ad to highlight Burke's job creation past as an executive at Trek Bicycles and as the Secretary of Commerce during Jim Doyle's time as governor. The ad then went on to knock the unemployment rate in Wisconsin since Governor Walker took office in January 2011. Click here to view the Burke ad.

The counter punch back from Governor Walker's campaign came very quickly where Mary Burke is accused of telling a lie about the unemployment rate since Governor Walker took office. The ad goes on to promote Governor Walker's job creation effort by creating 100,000 new jobs and concludes by saying "We can't trust Mary Burke." Click here to see the Walker ad.

This is the first of many, many television ads paid for by the respective campaigns for governor and as many, if not more, ads to come paid for by outside independent groups before Election Day in November 2014.

Rasmussen Poll: Gov race tied

The Rasmussen Reports released their first polling on Wisconsin's governor race and it showed the head to head matchup between Governor Scott Walker and challenger Mary Burke tied 45%-45%.

This poll shows a dip in Walker's numbers when compared to the Marquette Law School Poll done late in January which showed him leading Burke 47%-41%.

I suspect that a new Marquette Law School poll will be released over the next month and it will be interesting to compare those numbers with the two polls mentioned above. With its success over the past few years predicting final head to head numbers in statewide races, Charles Franklin and the Marquette Law School have been described as the polling "gold standard" for polling made public in Wisconsin.

DSPS online code change page: It's working

A reminder to please take advantage of DSPS's webpage to submit suggested changes to the Uniform Dwelling Code that will then be considered by the Uniform Dwelling Code Council (UDC Council).

Recently WBA Advocacy Chair Abe Degnan submitted a

code change dealing with safety glazed glass around doors. After submitting the request Abe was invited to address the UDC Council and share his thoughts on the matter.

After a good discussion with members of the UDC Council, a motion was made to make the clarification first suggested by the online form that Abe submitted.

So, if you have an issue the UDC, please take advantage of this online form today.

If you have a code concern, please take the time to click here. Once you get to this page, titled "DSPS Public Board Agenda Item", select "Dwelling Code Council" in the drop down form, and then enter your contact information. In the "Message" section state what part of the UDC you have an issue with (by code number), why it is an issue for builders, and a recommendation on how to improve the code.

Again, please take the time to fill out the online form so you can help guide the discussion of the UDC Council and make needed improvements to the UDC before the council concludes their work this summer!

WBA members talk wetland mapping with DNR staff

Recently a group of developers and a wetland consultant traveled to Madison to talk with DNR staff members on the issue of updated wetland maps. We learned that maps in the southeastern part of the state are updated every five years because of a partnership with a regional planning commission and maps outstate have a target time of being updated every ten years.

One interesting note, some are way behind in getting updated maps, most notably Buffalo, Trempealeau, Iowa, Lafayette, Taylor and Price, which have not been updated since 1978/1979.

The conversation was positive and ultimately the group asked the DNR for the following: changing some overlay maps that the DNR currently posts on their website to either eliminate some maps that create confusion or choosing a different color for some soil maps that are not good indicators of future wetlands; look at staffing changes to prioritize the linking of areas that have received wetland delineation maps to the overlay maps currently posted on the DNR website to depict more accurate maps than just aerial maps; better communication between DNR divisions to make sure those issuing permits for stormwater do not rely on the some of the less accurate soil maps to hold up permits.

We will be forwarding suggestions on the map layer provision mentioned above to DNR staff and following up with them on the other topics mentioned to track progress in the weeks to come.
