A Thank You from WBA President Jim Kubasta

As you by now already know, on November 2nd WBA went 3 for 3 with our endorsements when Wisconsin voters elected Scott Walker governor, Ron Johnson to a six-year term in the U.S. Senate and re-elected J.B. Van Hollen as Attorney General.

This was a tremendous team effort and I cannot thank you enough for all of your help along the way. Your generosity during these past few months has been second to none. From opening up your checkbook to taking the time to make phone calls and host a yard sign you have stepped up when we needed your help the most.

During these challenging economic times we were able to give more personal contributions to Scott Walker than we gave to Mark Green four years ago when the economy was in much better shape.

On behalf of all of the Senior Officers, we deeply appreciate your time and commitment. The movement to get our economy back on track starts today.

Walker Wins 52-47

In addition to turning 43 years old on November 2, Scott Walker was also elected Wisconsin's next governor. By a margin of 52% to 47% Scott Walker bested Milwaukee Mayor Tom Barrett.

In total WBA members contributed just shy of \$95,000 in personal contributions to Walker through the Builders Direct Fund conduit. The Building a Better Wisconsin PAC also contributed a total of \$25,500 to both Scott Walker and Lt. Governor-Elect Rebecca Kleefisch.

The transition for Governor Elect-Walker has already begun and WBA is working behind the scenes to book a meeting to discuss specific points of our 2011-2012 government affairs agenda.

Senator-Elect Ron Johnson (R-Oshkosh)

Oshkosh manufacturer Ron Johnson was able to knock off 18-year incumbent Russ Feingold by the same margin of victory as Scott Walker (52% to 47%).

Johnson becomes the first Republican to represent Wisconsin in the United States Senate since Bob Kasten.

WBA endorsed Johnson in October and the National Association of Home Builders (NAHB) BUILD PAC donated \$5,000 to his campaign in late September of this year.

Assembly GOP majority is at 60 seats

Most handicappers thought that the state Assembly was poised to come back in GOP hands but no one in their wildest dreams predicted they would come back today with 60 seats.

In addition to the 60 GOP seats, Representative Bob Ziegelbauer was also re-elected as an independent and said he plans to caucus with the GOP. That addition essentially puts the majority at 61 seats for the GOP.

The list of unexpected wins is honestly too long to list but certainly topping it is the defeat of the current Assembly Speaker Mike Sheridan (D-Janesville) and the longest serving member of the state Assembly Marlin Schneider (D-Wisconsin Rapids).

Members elected to the Wisconsin State Assembly

When legislators are sworn in on January 3, 2011 two current WBA members will be among those coming back as a member of the new 60 seat GOP majority.

WBA members elected to the state assembly include Michelle Litjens in the 56th district (Outagamie and Winnebago Counties) and Tom Larson in the 67th district (Chippewa and Dunn Counties).

We very much look forward to working with both Representative Elect Litjens and Larson for many sessions to come.

A 19 seat Senate GOP Majority

At some point during election night it looked like the number of GOP seats in the state Senate may have ended up as high as 20 or 21. The GOP will return to the majority in the state Senate for the first time since before the 2006 election with 19 seats.

All of the targeted races went the GOP's way last night with exception of Bob Jauch and Kathleen Vinehout holding onto their respective seats.

The current Senate Majority Leader Russ Decker was defeated by Dr. Pam Galloway which was the most shocking result of the 2010 state Senate elections.

Duffy, Ribble win; Kapanke comes up short

Sean Duffy will replace Dave Obey after defeating current state Senator Julie Lassa 52% to 44%. With the full backing of the Wisconsin BUILD PAC Trustees the NAHB BUILD PAC were early supporters of Duffy's efforts. In fact, NAHB was one of the few groups to financial support Duffy before Dave Obey's surprise announcement to retire earlier this year.

WBA member Reid Ribble was able to soundly defeat two-term Congressman Steve Kagen by a margin of 55% to 45%. NAHB BUILD PAC was able to make the maximum contribution to Ribble's campaign by giving him two \$5,000 contributions this fall.

No candidate finished with a stronger two weeks leading up to the election than state Senator Dan Kapanke in his race against Congressman Ron Kind.

Unfortunately for Kapanke he came up just short, losing to Congressman Kind 50% to 47%.

Kapanke returns to the majority in the state Senate to serve out the remaining two years of his four-year term.

The race no one talked about turns out as we thought

There was little double that Attorney General J.B. Van Hollen would be re-elected, the only real question was what his final margin of victory would be.

Van Hollen defeated former DNR Secretary Scott Hassett 58% to 42% to win a second four year term as Wisconsin Attorney General.

A true sign of a "wave election"

With little attention and fanfare GOP candidate Kurt Schuller was able to defeat incumbent State Treasurer Dawn Sass 53% to 47%

Sass defeated Jack Voight in 2006 in a huge democrat "wave election".

Schuller ran on the platform that he would work to pass a constitutional amendment to abolish the office of Wisconsin Treasure if elected.

Spikes are very valuable to our association because they work to bring in new members and encourage current members to renew their membership. Through the NAHB Spike Club, these members receive awards of silver and gold lapel pins, plagues, blazers and sweaters for their efforts in membership development.

At local membership meetings and at the NAHB annual Convention, Spikes proudly wear their hardearned blazers and sweaters, and on Spike Color Day at the Convention, thousands of Spikes are recognized on the board floor by the NAHB Board of Directors.

As additional recognition, all Spikes in good standing that have also recruited at least one new member during the Membership Year, are invited to attend the annual NAHB Spike Party held during the Convention in January.

To become a Spike, an individual must obtain 6 credits within two consecutive years. Spike members must then earn two credits until they reach Life Spike status with 25 credits.
