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



ADVOCACY DIGEST



Jarchow/Tiffany Homeowners Bill of Rights sent to Governor Walker

On Tuesday, November 7th both the state assembly and state senate went to the floor and voted on both bills that make up the Homeowners Bill of Rights. State Representative Adam Jarchow and State Senator Tom Tiffany and have been the lead

authors on these bills and have worked with WBA on many provisions in the bills throughout the process.

Both bills have been slightly altered since their introduction, following a joint public hearing of both of the legislature's housing committees, but a number of key policy items remain in both bills.

Some of the key provisions of the bills include:

- Review of the electrical code for one and two-family homes to move to a six-year cycle
- For any development project that requires an approval, if the applicant identifies the full scope of the project at the time of filing the application for the first approval required for the project, the existing requirements applicable in each political subdivision from which a subsequent approval is necessary at the time of filing are applicable to all subsequent approvals required for the project.
- Requires a city, village, town, or county to grant a conditional use permit if an applicant meets, or agrees to meet, all the requirements and conditions specified in the relevant ordinance. In addition, the bill requires those requirements and conditions to be reasonable and to the extent practicable measurable.
- Requires a city, village, town, or county to grant a conditional use permit if an applicant meets, or agrees to meet, all the requirements and conditions specified in the relevant ordinance. In addition, the bill requires those requirements and conditions to be reasonable and measurable.

Thank you to all members who helped advocate for the passage of these bills and a special thank you Representative Jarchow and Senator Tiffany for their leadership to pass these important bills to lower the cost of housing for Wisconsin families.

Wetland overhaul bill introduced

Recently, legislation authored by Representative Jim Steineke and Senator Roger Roth to streamline the permitting process in Wisconsin was introduced as Assembly Bill 547. (link: https://docs.legis.wisconsin.gov/2017/related/proposals/ab547.pdf). Soon, the senate version of this bill will also be introduced by Senator Roth.

A great deal of work remains to move this legislation forward, as there are an equal number of groups both for and against this legislation.

This bill would no longer require a permit to fill a nonfederal wetland in Wisconsin, and, in exchange for that, a landowner would be required to replace the filled nonfederal wetland at a 1 to 1.2-acre ratio. If this legislation is passed, it would actually increase the total number of acres of wetlands in Wisconsin.

Another important provision of the bill is it requires the DNR to spend all the money in its in lieu of fee program no later than June 30, 2019. If passed this would mean as much or more than \$18 million be spent to create additional wetlands in Wisconsin. DNR has been collecting these fees for a number of years to create additional wetlands but has been slow to use those funds.

Reminder: we need as many examples as possible of how the regulation of nonfederal wetlands has increased the cost of housing options for families, so we can present them during a public hearing on this bill. GSE, taxes, and flood insurance talks with Congressman Duffy

Recetly the WBA was invited to send members to a housing roundtable discussion by the Federal Home Loan Bank of Chicago in Milwaukee with Congressman Sean Duffy. The main topic of conversation was housing finance reform. In attendance on behalf of the WBA was President David Belman and Past Advocacy Chair Jim Doering. Former NAHB President Ed Brady was in attendance as well.

Prior to the meeting, NAHB government affairs staff provided specific guidance on policy issues and topics to cover. Congressman Duffy has also started holding similar discussions with various interested parties on the topic of housing finance, or the reform of Fannie and Freddie MAC, in Washington D.C.

Some of the highlights of the discussion with Congressman Duffy included his realization that having no federal backstop for housing finance was not an option. He stated that he was working towards bipartisan support of a reform package, and that these is still a need for a "catastrophic backstop" for housing finance (he did not specifically define that term).

Regarding flood insurance, Congressman Duffy stated that they are "getting close" to a final bill that would be moved for a vote by the full House of Representatives.

NAHB's change of position on the tax reform package was briefly discussed as well. Congressman Duffy stated that tax reform is an "American issue" and not an issue of one single interest group and that the plan is "not perfect but needs to get done."

Development package in the works

The WBA Advocacy Group was updated recently on many provisions that may be contained in a package of reforms to streamline the development process. This bill is being drafted by State Representative Rob Brooks.


Some of the items currently contained in this reform package by Representative Brooks include the elimination of the park fees as a condition of plat approval (but keeping park fees under the impact fee section of state statutes); tweaks to the provisions to make bonds more available as surety for developer financed infrastructure, possibly capping impact fees and only allowing a modest increase each year, an increase to levy limits for municipalities that increase housing starts, making sure code standards above the Uniform Dwelling Code to be mandated in a developer's agreement, and a prohibition on local units of government from enacting an ordinance on stormmwater management that is higher than the statewide standard.

We are hopeful that this package of changes can be introduced for cosponsors soon which would hopefully set up the opportunity for another joint housing committee to hold a public hearing on the provision. The goal would be to have this bill passed both standing committees in each house and available for a floor vote in January.

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

Job Summary:

Serve as Association Manager, recommend and participate in the formation of new policies and make decisions within the existing policies as they have been approved by the Board of Directors. Plan, organize, direct and coordinate staff, programs and activities of the Association to ensure that objectives are attained, plans fulfilled and member needs are met. Maintain effective internal and external relationships. Through effective management and leadership, achieve economical, productive performance, forward looking programming and constructive growth of the Association. Mentor and assist Association committees as required to meet committee objectives and timelines.

Primary Duties and Responsibilities:

Within the limits of the bylaws and policies of the Association, the Association Manager is responsible to accomplish the following duties:

- Keep the Board of Directors, Executive Committee and officers fully informed on the conditions and operations of the Association. Attend all meetings of the Board of Directors, Executive committee and committees established by the Board with the exception of Personnel committee.
- Plan, formulate and recommend for Board approval basic policies and programs which will further the objectives of the Association.
- Execute all formally approved decisions of the Board of Directors.
- Develop, for the purpose of day-to-day administration, specific policies, procedures, programs and review the same with Executive committee for ultimate submittal to the Board of Directors for approval. Implement policies, procedures and programs adopted by the Board of Directors.
- Establish a sound organizational structure for any headquarters staff, or contracted services.
- Direct and coordinate all approved programs, projects, and major activities of the headquarters staff, and contracted services, as assigned by the Board, to include, but not limited to:
- Receive, scan and distribute mail as received no less than weekly.
- Answer the Association phone, record conversations and messages using a phone log to create a permanent written record, and transmit them to the appropriate person by voice and email in a timely fashion.
- Record and deposit to the bank incoming money within 24 hours of receipt.
- Perform accounting and reporting activities that include: use of QuickBooks Pro for

billing, accounts receivable, accounts payable, payroll and compliance, payroll filing and reports to all committees and Board. This specific set of responsibilities will require reporting to, and meeting with, our Treasurer monthly and public accountant annually for 990 prep and filing. Payables are to be recorded as received, and paid weekly, with checks and authorization forms prepared for officer signatures in advance.

- Assist the finance committee with preparing an annual budget and keeping our accounts receivable current, and advising the officers and Board of delinquent accounts on a monthly basis.
- Membership administration activities to include: Dues invoices sent out monthly by mail, with follow-up by email and phone. Receive and deposit payments, manage local, state and national membership rosters. Coordinate new member packet distribution (Touch Program), newsletter information and meeting registrations. Manage member contact information.
- In the absence of the WABA Secretary or under the direction of President, provide clerical and reporting support to our Board and committees which will include recording meetings, converting meeting notes to typed form for distribution, scheduling meetings, providing materials as requested, and any other support as needed, including attending WABA functions and activities as directed.
- Recruit, hire, indoctrinate, train and motivate any Association staff, while being responsible for major activities of the headquarters staff.
- Manage and supervise the work of other employees, contracted services and members of the Association in order to forward the goals of WABA.
- Obtain maximum utilization of staff and contracted services, by clearly defining their duties, establishing performance standards, conducting performance reviews and maintaining a competitive salary structure.
- Attend all WBA events, meetings and gatherings to gain insight and information for the benefit of WABA members. Attend annual WBA EO summit. Attend NAHB IBS related EO meetings, training sessions or events or one other NAHB EO opportunity during each calendar year.

This position will be supervised, directed by and report directly to the President of the Association. In addition, this person will report to the Association's Personnel committee for the purpose of maintaining job description, annual performance evaluation and periodic compensation review.


