

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

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


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Walker Chief of Staff named

Recently Governor-elect Scott Walker announced that Keith Gilkes has been named his Chief of Staff. Gilkes will begin serving in this new roll once Walker is inaugurated on January 3, 2011.

Gilkes is a veteran of state government and political campaigns in Wisconsin even though he is in his early thirties.

Gilkes first served as a staff member for Representative Carol Owens (R-Oshkosh) and finally as a policy advisor in the office of State Senator Scott Fitzgerald (R-Juneau). Gilkes went on to help spearhead the campaign efforts of the Committee to Elect a Republican Senate (CERS) in various capacities in 2006 and 2008.

In his capacity as chief campaign strategists for CERS in the 2008 cycle Gilkes was able to hold the number of senate republicans to 18-15 in one of the toughest cycles for the GOP in decades. Holding the number of GOP incumbents to 15 allowed CERS to go on the offense this campaign cycle and pick up 4 seats, more than enough to get back into the majority.

"Keith did an outstanding job building a team in every corner of Wisconsin," said

Governor Elect Walker. "He is a trusted advisor and his background in state government will assist my administration in developing the policies needed to create an environment for 250,000 new jobs in our state."

Keith Gilkes has served as Walker's campaign manager since April 2009, successfully building a statewide organization in all 72 counties that resulted in an electoral victory on November 2nd.

"I'm honored to serve in the administration as well as help Governor-elect Walker accomplish the goals laid out during the campaign," said Gilkes. "Scott Walker will help set a new course for Wisconsin state government and I look forward to assisting him as he builds a team to get Wisconsin back to work."

Representative Murtha Appointed Assembly Housing Committee Chair

State Rep. John Murtha (R-Baldwin) has been appointed to serve as Chairman of the Assembly Committee on Housing for the 2011-2012 Legislative Session. His appointment was recently announced by Assembly Speaker-elect Jeff Fitzgerald.

"I believe Rep. Murtha has the knowledge and experience needed to successfully lead the Housing Committee this session and help guide our state's housing market toward a steady recovery," said Speaker-elect Fitzgerald. "I look forward to working with him in this regard as we pursue an ambitious agenda of creating jobs and getting folks back into the homes they lost during this economic downturn."

As Chairman of the Committee on Housing, Rep. Murtha will oversee legislation brought before the committee concerning the housing industry, programs offering mortgage assistance, real estate issues, and the housing market in general to name a few.

"I am honored to have been appointed by Speaker-elect Fitzgerald to serve as Chair of the Housing Committee," said Rep. Murtha. "Wisconsin's housing industry has been hit hard by the economic recession, and I am ready to take on the challenge of getting construction crews back on job sites and families affected by the economy back into their homes."

Business Day in Madison: February 23, 2011

WBA's annual lobby day, Business Day in Madison, is set again for Wednesday, February 23, 2011.

WBA will again be joining other business groups for this event to be held at the Monona Terrace in downtown Madison.

The items that we will be promoting during our lobby day will be developed after the introduction of Governor-Elect Walker's job creation and regulatory reform bills are introduced. We have made a number of suggestions to the governor-elect on important public policy we would like to see move forward to kick of the 2011-2012 session. Items that remain after those bills are introduced will be considered for inclusion to advocate for at Business Day in Madison 2011.

Senator Elect Lasee named Senate Housing Chair

Senator Elect Frank Lasee (R-Green Bay) was recently named the chair of the Senate Housing and Insurance Committee.

Lasse returns to elected office after cruising to 20% victory this fall over Dr. Monk Elmer to retain the 1st Senate District for the GOP. Senator Allan Lasee did not seek reelection to the 1st Senate District seat this fall.

Lasee has worked closely with WBA in the past on a number of land use issues and before leaving the state assembly was also a long time Friend of Housing award winner.

We are looking forward to again working with Senator Elect Lasee this session on housing issues this session.

WHEDA/B-Bonds to increase lending options pitched

AD&C financing issues continue to be at the top of the list of concerns when we talk to members across the state. NAHB has made this the top issue that they are currently working on with legislators and regulators on the federal levels.

We have been talking with members of the Walker transition on this issue as well to explore options on the state level to make more credit available to builders and consumers.

Recently we had extensive conversations concerning the expanded use of B-Bonds to increase the availability of credit for builders.

We are also exploring expanding the authority of the Wisconsin Housing and Economic Development Authority (WHEDA) has to help banks guarantee residential loans to consumers.

We will continue to explore these options on the state level in an effort to help address this problem for both consumers and the construction industry.

How will policy move forward during the next six months?

A great deal of attention has been given to Governor-elect Walker's efforts to call a special session once he takes office on January 3, 2011 to get to work right away on job creation with the legislature. It appears that special session will include four specific issues including reform of the Department of Commerce, state tax deductions for health savings accounts (HSAs), tort reform and regulatory reform. These special session bills will contain items that have the greatest overall impact on the entire Wisconsin economy.

Most expect these special session bills to move very quickly to start the session in January.

After that you will likely see both houses of the legislature working with Governor-elect Walker and his team on an agenda to further address issues pertaining to jobs and regulatory reform.

Working on a parallel track will be the writing of the next state budget that all recognize will be a very difficult to tackle with the looming \$3 billion state budget deficit. The state budget will also be a great vehicle to address and correct some of the many overreaches that were contained in the last state budget (issues like prevailing wage).



Spikes are very valuable to our association because they work to bring in new members and encourage current members to renew their membership. Created in 1953, the NAHB Spike Program is designed to recognize and reward those members who are actively involved in recruitment and retention of members. There are currently 15.164 Spikes in local associations across the country and almost an equal member of Spike Candidates, those individuals working to obtain Spike status. Through the NAHB Spike Club, these members receive awards of silver and gold lapel pins, plagues, blazers and sweaters for their efforts in membership development.

At local membership meetings and at the NAHB annual Convention, Spikes proudly wear their hardearned blazers and sweaters, and on Spike Color Day at the Convention, thousands of Spikes are recognized on the board floor by the NAHB Board of Directors.

As additional recognition, all Spikes in good standing that have also recruited at least one new member during the Membership Year, are invited to attend the annual NAHB Spike Party held during the Convention in January.

To become a Spike, an individual must obtain 6 credits within two consecutive years. Spike members must then earn two credits until they reach Life Spike status with 25 credits.
