

UDC Council stops \$4500 code increase per home

Recently the Uniform
Dwelling Code (UDC)
Council continued their
yearlong review of the UDC
when they discussed the
important issue of revising
the energy code.

After thoroughly studying this important issue, the

committee voted unanimously to reject efforts to move Wisconsin to the 2012 IRC energy code. WBA worked with UDC Council members leading up to the vote to educate them on the negative cost implications to this proposed change. Those in favor of the change also lobbied in favor of the 2012 IRC energy code.

This change would have increased the cost of a single family home in Wisconsin by between \$3600 and \$6200 per home.

Thank you to all of the members of the Uniform Dwelling Code Council for your commitment to keeping housing affordable in Wisconsin!

UDC looking to clarify Wisconsin's deck code

The UDC Council is also looking at improvements to Wisconsin's deck code. The current Wisconsin deck code is fairly minimal and the council believes with more new homes being built with a deck that this issue deserves careful consideration.

The council discussed this topic for four hours at their last meeting and likely will be discussing it again during their January meeting as well.

Once they have worked further on this issue, we will be sharing with you a summary of the proposals they are considering to get further input before the council moves forward.

Shoreland zoning after annexation and vested right bills signed into law

On December 12th Governor Walker made things

official when he signed two WBA supported bills into law.

Legislation to streamline Wisconsin's shoreland zoning regulations in annexed areas received Governor Walker's stamp of approval and became 2013 Wisconsin Act 80. You may remember from previous Friday Updates that this issue has been on the WBA Advocacy Agenda for the past decade. It is also worth noting that the signing of this bill means WBA went 3 for 3 on items that were lobbied on during Business Day in Madison 2013 (the other items were a 6 year review of the UDC and the elimination of the Building Contractor Registration (BCR).

Finally a bill to provide "vested rights" when applying for a local permit was also signed into law this week becoming 2013 Wisconsin Act 74.

Sen. Lehman announces run for Lieutenant Governor

Wisconsin Democrats now have at least one candidate who will be running for lieutenant governor in 2014, State Senator John Lehman (D-Racine). Lehman will be passing on running for reelection to the state senate seat he was first elected to in 2016, lost in 2010 and then regained in a recall election in the summer of 2012. Before redistricting this seat was a lean democrat seat on the numbers but after redistricting which took the City of Racine almost entirely out of the district and is now considered a safe seat for the GOP.

Lehman's announcement is the third retirement announced in the state senate joining Senators Tim Cullen (D-Janesville) and Bob Jauch (D-Poplar). There are two other state senators that may choose to not run again as well. State Senator Kathleen Vienhout (D-Alma) is mulling another run for governor and would have to give up her state senate seat to do so. State Senator Dale Schultz (R-Richland Center) faces a GOP primary opponent in Representative Howard Marklein (R-Spring Green) who is sitting on over \$100,000 in the bank while Schultz did little to no fundraising during the

last reporting period and may ultimately decide not to seek reelection as well.

From NAHB: October Housing - Permits Strong, **Starts Delayed**

The Census Bureau reported on building permits, but the housing starts data has been delayed until December 18 due to the partial federal government shutdown in early October. The pace of building permit issuance rose to a seasonally adjusted annual rate of 974 thousand in September and rose again to 1,034 thousand annually in October. The pace of August permitting was revised up to 926 thousand annually.

Single family permitting continued its steady progress at a pace of 620 thousand annually in October, but the strength in today's report was concentrated in the multifamily sector where permitting surged to 414 thousand units annually.

That's according to the permits data (issued by local jurisdictions) but it's worth noting that the

> composition of activity is likely to change when we see the actual starts data in December. The single family starts are likely to reflect stronger growth than seen in the permits data because building in non-permit issuing areas is included in the starts data, and some permits are reclassified from multifamily to single family when started.

> The reclassifications occur when local jurisdictions define some configurations multifamily (e.g., townhouses) but the Census Bureau treats them as single family. These reclassifications boost single family starts relative to permits and depress multifamily starts relative to permits.

Overall, today's report is a positive signal that the government shutdown and the uncertainty surrounding the ongoing negotiations to keep the government running have not yet taken a toll on the housing market recovery. but we'll see how much of that strength is sustained in December's housing starts report and in the months ahead.

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COLLABORATE ON THE GO

In today's mobile working environment, it's uncommon that everyone working on a particular project is in the same building. Mobility does not have to mean extra challenges and working with your team does not have to stop when you leave your desk. There are a number of web-based collaboration apps that let you stay organized whether you're at your desk, on your smartphone or using your tablet.

- Trello (http://trello.com) is a free service that allows you create boards for specific projects. You can then
 add checklists, attach files, images or documents, insert deadlines, invite team members and assign
 tasks. Revisions made by others appear instantaneously on your screen and you can visit the activity log
 to see the latest changes. In addition to the free option, there is also a business class that provides
 additional features for an annual fee.
- Collaborate (http://www.collaborate.com) is a unified document sharing, task management and team
 communication site that is optimized for mobile use. One major highlight of the service is its integration
 with popular cloud services like DropBox™, Evernote™ and Google Drive™. Plans start at 1-5 users
 with different file size and storage options.
- Quip (https://quip.com) focuses specifically on document collaboration. You can share documents or
 entire folders so multiple people can edit and discuss in a single workspace. Messages and comments
 are combined into a chat-like thread with the document, helping to cut down on emails and make
 teamwork more efficient. Quip is free, but has some business functionality that can be purchased on a
 per user basis.

These are just a few examples of tools that let you collaborate on the go. If you already use a program to manage projects or documents with your team, do some research and see if there's a mobile app available to optimize productivity when you're working away from your desk.

WBA Announces New Leader, Exciting New Direction
