

### ome Show attendance 8,100

prehensive show and three other shows in the Marathon Park area contributed to record attendance at this year's Home Show this past weekend at Marathon Park's Multi - Purpose Building.

More than 8,100 people attended the show, which was sponsored by the Wausau Area Builders Association. That represents a 3,000-person increase over last year's show, according to Diane Dalnodar, the executive official of the association.

"It was a fantastic show with no complaints," she said today. Both the exhibitors and the public seemed happy with it."

The show, which opened at 6 p.m. Friday and ran to 5 p.m. Sunday, offered more than 80 exhibitions relating to homes.

Information and displays covered such things as insulation, home financing, site selection, stick building, factory built homes, carpeting, vinyl, upholstering, heating, air conditioning, appliances, lighting, pumps, wells, water conditioning, hardware, fireplaces, masonry, furniture, interior decorating, paneling, painting, interior decorating, building supplies, furniture and tiles.

Between 400 and 500 people worked on the show. Most provided information on products and services displayed. Others worked behind the scenes in organizing, setting up, run-ning and cleaning up the show. "Everyone put in a tremen-

dous effort," said Mrs. Dalnodar.

Fred Anderson of FDA Architects handled the floor plans; Mrs. Dalnodar and Jay Klieber of Diversified Home Builders Inc. handled most of the planning; and Evy Wegner of D & D Residential Contractors handled the food services.





### Business Day 2012 brings 100+ to Madison

Recently over 100 WBA members from across the state traveled to Madison for our annual lobby day, Business Day in Madison. This year makes the tenth year WBA has joined with other business groups, most notably the Wisconsin Manufacturers and Commerce (WMC), on this day-long event revolving around lobbying.

WBA members started the day with an issue briefing by WBA professional staff on topics to discuss with their elected officials. Thos topics included:

- Support DNR Regulation Reform
- Support Wetland Reforms
- Support Department of Safety and Professional Services (DSPS)
  Clean Up Legislation
- Housing=Good Paying Wisconsin Jobs

Other speakers that addressed the group during the day included Elections: Frank Luntz "What is Really on the Mind of America?"; Energy: Robert Bryce - "Five Reasons to be Optimistic About Future Energy and Power Supplies"; Economy: Todd Buchholz - "The Economy in the Age of Obama"; and an address by Governor Scott Walker to conclude the day.

Thank you so much to all of those that took time to attend Business Day in Madison 2012 and helped us push the above items to hopefully conclude the 2011-2012 legislative session.

### State of the State: We are headed in the right direction

In late-January Governor Walker addressed a joint session of the legislature and the citizens of Wisconsin to update them on the State of the State. The message by

Governor Walker was clear: the policies passed in the last year are working and our state is headed in the right direction.

"When I addressed you in this chamber last January, Wisconsin had suffered through three years of 150,000 of our fellow citizens losing their jobs," Governor Walker said, "The unemployment rate was 7.5%. And after years of tax increases and budget tricks, Wisconsin faced one of the largest budget deficits in the country. Now, our unemployment rate is down from a vear ago. In fact, it's the lowest it's been since 2008. We are turning things around. We are heading in the right direction."

The lowlight of the speech was the fact that unruly protesters from the gallery of the State Assembly interrupted the speech on four separate occasions during the thirty minute speech.

### Walker looking good in polling

Recently Marquette University Law School announced the first in a series of polls testing Wisconsinites opinions on the recall election for governor, the U.S. Senate race, the hypothetical race for President, and the opinion of how people think the economy is doing.

The first round of polling looks good for Governor Walker in head to head match ups of all the major candidates mentioned as a democratic challenger. Walker leads Milwaukee Mayor Tom Barrett by a 50 percent to 44 percent margin. Walker leads the only announced Democratic candidate, former Dane County Executive Kathleen Falk, with a 49 percent to 42 percent margin. Walker leads former Congressman David Obey by 49 percent to 43 percent. Janesville Democratic State Senator Tim Cullen receives 40 percent to Walker's 50 percent.

The Marquette Law School Poll of 701 Wisconsin registered voters was conducted January 19-22 by both landline and cellular telephone. It is the first in a series of polls throughout the 2012 election year.

While Walker leads his possible democratic challengers President Obama leads Mitt Romney 48% to 40%.

Finally, the poll did an extensive set of questions to gauge the opinion of Wisconsinites on a number of issues. The summary those issues is follows and shows some of the items as very popular (voter identification) and others divide the state almost in half:

- 74 percent favored and 22 percent opposed requiring state workers to pay more for pension and health benefits
- 66 percent favored and 32 percent opposed the state's new voter ID law
- 48 percent favored and 47 percent opposed limiting state employee unions' ability to bargain over benefits and non-wage issues
- 46 percent favored and 51 percent opposed the new law legalizing the possession of concealed weapons
- 38 percent favored and 55 percent opposed limiting the number of people eligible for the BadgerCare health assistance program
- 29 percent favored and 65 percent opposed reductions in state aid to public school

### Senate Dems get their candidates of choice

It was learned recently that the State Senate Democratic Campaign Committee (SSDC) successfully recruited candidates that will challenge three of the four GOP state senators that are being recalled this spring/summer.

Lined up to run against Senator Van Wanggaard (R-Racine) is the man who Wanggaard bested for the job in 2010, former State Senator John Lehman (D-Racine). Senator Pam Galloway (R-Wausau) will face Representative Donna Seidel (D-Wausau). Finally, Senator Terry Moulton (R-Chippewa Falls) will face the women who beat him for is state assembly seat in 2008, former state Representative Kristen Dexter (D-Eau Claire).

Most insiders seem to think Seidel and Dexter are pretty good recruits to run against Galloway and Moulton. Most believe that while John Lehman likely has good name i.d. in the Racine area but are very mixed on him as a top flight candidate running for his old state senate seat.

### Lasee/Cullen Abort Bids for Higher Office

Two state senators who had been eyeing a move up to higher office both decided against making the leap to campaign for higher office.

State Senator Frank Lasee (R-Green Bay) had been toying with the idea of joining the gentlemen mentioned above in a run for U.S. Senate but ultimately decided to stay put in the state senate.

Lasee said of the race for U.S. Senate that, "It is important to send a real conservative to Washington to work for us, someone with the right ideas that will get our country working again. A conservative that understands that we must get the government out of the way, balance our budget without raising taxes and create an energy policy that increases supply and lowers costs."

Another State Senator, Tim Cullen (D-Janesville), has decided against a run for governor in the 2012 recall election of Governor Scott Walker. Cullen had been seen as the moderate alternative to more left leaning candidates like Kathleen Falk.

Sighting fundraising difficulties and the fact that even if he won the political atmosphere would still be impossible to effectively govern were the reasons Cullen stated for not running.

So far, Kathleen Falk and State Senator Kathleen Vinehout (D-Alma) are the only registered democrats who are running for governor in the recall election against Governor Walker with Cullen's departure from the race.

### Save the date: May 3rd event for Governor Scott Walker

The announcement of two candidates who want his job, Governor Walker continues his efforts to talk with voters about the positive changes he has made to state government. In addition to telling that story, Governor Walker also continues to raise money for his campaign fund.

During and after the WBA Board of Directors meeting on Thursday, May 3rd at the Chula Vista Resort in Wisconsin Dells, Governor Walker will be updating the membership on his campaign to close the meeting.

Immediately following the WBA Board of Directors meeting, WBA members from across the state are invited to attend a fundraising reception to help Governor Walker in his recall election.

Final details of the event are still being worked out and we will report back to you once those are finalized, but we wanted to get you the date ASAP.

This may be the only WBA fundraiser for Governor Walker because of a tight time frame, so we encourage all members to attend this event on Thursday, May 3rd at the Chula Vista Resort in Wisconsin Dells!
