Advocacy Group discusses 2015-16 agenda

Recently the WBA Advocacy Group had a great discussion of the draft WBA Advocacy Agenda for the 2015-2016 legislative session that begins in January 2015. The Advocacy Group went through each point of the draft agenda that was put together in conjunction with WBA

Advocacy Chair Abe Degnan and Vice-Chair Jim Doering.

WBA is using the extended review period for the WBA Advocacy Agenda that has been used for the past two sessions which is to review the draft in July, take comments on additions and changes, then come back to both the Advocacy Group and finally the WBA Board of Directors for a final vote during our meeting on October 23.

One of the bigger pieces of public policy contained in the draft WBA Advocacy Agenda is changes to the current state law on contractor education. This portion of the draft agenda has been under consideration since January of this year when we first started to take input from members on possible changes to the law. That was followed up by an additional listening session on the topic during our April meeting.

Enclosed are the changes being considered to the current state statutes on contractor education which come from the comments and suggestions from members during the past three Advocacy Group meetings.

Contractor Education reform package:

- Require a minimum of 3 credits on safety issues including OSHA training
- Require a minimum of 3 credits on business management, contracts and lien law (financial planning, general business operations 101, change orders, contracts, do business in writing, and dispute resolution)
- Require a minimum of 3 credits on code changes and recent legal/legislative changes
- Require 3 elective credits
- Require that 6 credits must be in person credits and 6 credits can be online
- Require inspectors to document DSPS contractor numbers on final inspection documentation
- · Require municipalities send a report each year showing

- what contractors pulled a building permit and their current credential number and expiration date
- Withhold shared revenue/fire dues payments (or some other type of payment) to municipalities who do not supply the above mentioned report each year

The schedule is not completely finalized but it is likely to start with our issue briefing in the morning, welcome, and back to back speakers for the morning session, lunch with featured speaker Governor Walker (pending the November election), time for state capitol office visits after lunch and John Stoessel addressing the group at 3 pm.

We also have been working with the Wisconsin Manufacturers and Commerce (WMC) Foundation that helps put the event together to keep the price of the event down. WMC is considering a discount for groups that sign up 100 or members to attend.

Happ advances to take on Schimel in AG race

Two district attorneys will now face off in November to replace retiring Wisconsin Attorney General J.B. Van Hollen. Jefferson County District Attorney Susan Happ, fresh off a convincing 52% win in a three person primary is now set to face Waukesha County District Attorney Brad Schimel in November. Finishing behind Happ were State Representative Jon Richards at 33% and Dane County District Attorney Ismael Ozanne with 15%.

Happ is an interesting candidate. comes from a GOP county and was the most moderate sounding candidate during the Typically the most moderate primary. candidate in either party has a hard time


advancing to the general election.


For a lot of you this event is about the opportunity to try something you may have never done before. Give it a whirl, you might like it. Just like our two ladies did this year.
